



## WHERE DO I GO TO VOTE?

Same Day Voter Registration, or conditional voter registration, is available at the Elections Office, Satellite Offices (Salida, Oakdale, Patterson and Turlock) and every poll in Stanislaus County. The County uses a special envelope for voters registering on the same day with a registration form printed on one side. There are simple steps you can complete in one visit: you register to vote, you vote, you seal your ballot in the special envelope and you sign the envelope. You are now permanently registered to vote. Political party matters for the Presidential Primary Election. Registered to vote <b>before</b> the 15-day deadline (February 18, 2020)	Elections Office, any Satellite Office OR your polling place	Vote a regular ballot
Registered to vote <b>after</b> the 15-day deadline (February 18, 2020)	Elections Office or any Satellite Office starting the Saturday before or on Election Day. On Election Day you can also register at your polling place.	Complete a voter registration form. Vote using Same Day Voter Registration* (Vote conditionally)
Are not registered to vote	Elections Office or any Satellite Office starting the Saturday before or on Election Day. On Election Day you can also register at your polling place.	Complete a voter registration form. Vote using Same Day Voter Registration* (Vote conditionally)
Are registered in another county	Your new County Elections Office anytime or any Satellite Office starting the Saturday before Election Day. On Election Day you can also register at your new polling place.	Complete a voter registration form. Vote using Same Day Voter Registration* (Vote conditionally)
Have moved within the county where you are registered to vote or changed your name	Elections Office or any Satellite Office starting the Saturday before Election Day. On Election Day you can also register at your new polling place.	Complete a voter registration form. Vote using Same Day Voter Registration* (Vote conditionally)
Vote by mail, but do not have your vote by mail ballot	Your polling place, Elections Office, or any Satellite Office starting the Saturday before Election Day.	Vote provisionally*
Are not near your polling place	Visit any Satellite Office starting the Saturday before Election Day. Or, visit any polling place. However, the local contests may not be on that ballot type.	Vote provisionally*
Name not found in the voter roster, but you know you are registered to vote	Check your voter registration status at <a href="http://voterstatus.sos.ca.gov">voterstatus.sos.ca.gov</a>	Vote provisionally*
Arrive after 8:00 pm on Election Night	A poll worker will be assigned to stand behind the last voter in line that arrived before 8 pm. Any voter standing behind that poll worker arrived late. Voter's arrival time is marked on the envelope. The right of any voter to cast a provisional ballot cannot be denied. However, ballots cast by late voters will not be counted.	Vote provisionally*

\*Your vote will be counted after elections officials: Verify your signature on the ballot envelope matches the one on your voter registration form; Verify you provided all the information needed to identify you on your voter registration form -- including your name, home (residence) address, and date of birth; and confirm you have not already voted. Forty days after Election Day, voters can visit [www.stanvote.com](http://www.stanvote.com) or call 525-5201 to see if their vote counted.
